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
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


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## SMSC: Community Art project

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## Safeguarding updates:

### Family days out in Staffordshire

### Keeping safe over the Easter break:

Ensure a safe Easter holiday in the UK by maintaining routines, managing online safety, and supervising outdoor activities. Key tips include knowing your child's location, setting online boundaries, checking holiday accommodation safety, and discussing safety with them. Utilize community resources, keep emergency contacts handy, and prepare children for changes in routine.

#### Online Safety (E-Safety) Tips

- Set SMART Rules: Follow Childnet's SMART rules: Keep personal information Safe, never Meet online strangers, Accept files only from known sources, check for Reliable information, and Tell a trusted adult if uncomfortable.
- Monitor Gaming/Social Media: Discuss who they are talking to and ensure they do not share personal details.

#### At Home & Out and About:

- Know Where They Are: Always know who your children are with and where they are.
- Home Alone Safety: If leaving children alone, ensure they know their address and two contact phone numbers. Remove hazards, secure dangerous items, and discuss emergency procedures.
- Outdoor Safety: Use helmets for bikes/scooters and be vigilant around water. Teach children to identify authority figures (police, shop assistants) if they get lost.
- Public Safety: Be aware of potential risks in crowded areas, such as crowded events. Arrange a meeting place if you get separated.
